

# U of L & Planned Parenthood re: U of L and Abortion

*Are public funds being used to train teens for Planned Parenthood?*

According to the University of Louisville document -- "*The Kenneth J. Ryan Residency Training Program Adolescent Peer Educator and Cross Training Collaborative*" -- medical residents from OB GYN and Pediatrics are used to train teens for Planned Parenthood of Indiana and Kentucky (PPINK)'s 'Youth Peer Educator Project.'



According to the document obtained last week through an open records request, the intent of the program is to train medical residents to equip high school students to then go into the community and train their peers on behalf of Planned Parenthood. The residents teach the high school students about various sex topics including:

*"Adolescent Healthcare Confidentiality: A Resource Guide for Clinical Options & Patient Rights", and*

*"Sexual Response Cycle: Understanding Sexual Physiology."*

"Benefits" of the program for the teens include, "ACLU Rally Day at the Capitol." ✓

The document claims that PPINK and U of L are just getting started on their collaboration with plans to expand to ALL medical students and beyond.

The 18-page, wordy document describing the program contains lots of information about sexual topics covered, but one word was conspicuously absent -- **abstinence**.
